Moreover, he has been listed in 'Best Doctors of America' for over 20 years. He has served as Chair of the Exam Writing Committee for the Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA) for many years. He is the current President of the Michigan Infectious Disease Society. His academic interests include the management of infections in cancer patients/stem cell transplant recipients. He has published over 200 articles and several book chapters and has been a speaker at many National and International meetings. He has been instrumental in developing the Division of Infectious Diseases in India by providing on-site observationship and training to a large number of passionate ID doctors at Wayne State University.



**Dr. Payal K. Patel** MD. MPH. FIDSA

Associate Professor, Division of Infectious Diseases Department of Internal Medicine, The University of Michigan Health System, Ann Arbor VA Healthcare. She is currently the Medical Director of the Antimicrobial Stewardship Program and the Chair of the Antimicrobial Stewardship Committee at the Veterans Affairs Ann Arbor Healthcare System. She completed her fellowship in Infectious Diseases at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center / Harvard Medical School and Master of Public Health from the Harvard School of Public Health. She is the proud recipient of the 2021 Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA) Antibiotic Stewardship Scholar Award and 2021 Johns Hopkins University Distinguished Alumni Award. Moreover, Dr. Patel is also an active member of the SHEA, the Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA), and a "Stand Up to Superbugs" Ambassador" with the Pew Charitable Trusts. She is also the voting member of the presidential Advisory council on Antibiotic resistance.



**Dr. Anup Warrier**DNB (Med), CIC, CTH,
FRCP, FIDSA

Infectious Diseases Consultant, Department of Infectious Diseases and Infection Control, Aster Medcity, Kochi. A physician with over 15 years of experience and specialized training in the management of infectious diseases and infections in hospitals. He has been active in implementing infection control measures that meet the standards of JCI and the Antimicrobial Stewardship Program (AMSP) standards that have earned the IDSA Center of Excellence (COE) title. He has also been a medical administrator for over eight years, now handling the roles of head of quality and then chief of medical services for Aster MedCity. Dr. Anup is a member of the state committee on the AMR action plan as well as the National Committee on IPC (NCDC) and SHEA international ambassador (2015). Moreover, he was the Healthcare Asia Management Award winner twice (2016 and 2018), the SHEA International Research Grant winner, and a member of the National Infection Control Guidelines Committee.



**Dr. Jesse T Jacob**

Dr. Jacob graduated from Johns Hopkins University and the University of South Florida. He completed his residency and chief residency in Internal medicine at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, followed by a fellowship in infectious diseases at Emory University, where he is currently a Professor of Medicine and Epidemiology. He as Hospital Epidemiologist and Co-Director of the Antibiotic Stewardship Program. He was elected to the SSCI (Social Sciences Citation index) in 2015 and is an active member of the SSCI as well as the Society of Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA) and the Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA). His research focuses on three areas of Healthcare Epidemiology: antibiotic optimization, prevention of transmission of infection with a focus on the environment and assessing risk factors and outcomes for infections with Multidrug-resistant organisms.

Prior to joining CHESS/CDC, she has worked as an adult infectious diseases and antimicrobial stewardship pharmacist at Michigan Medicine. Dr. Patel has published numerous peer-reviewed manuscripts in the areas of antimicrobial stewardship and infectious diseases. He holds the position of Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Medicine in the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine of Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio, USA. Hisham has American Board Pharmacy Certifications in Critical Care Medicine and Infectious Diseases. He earned his Bachelor of Pharmacy from Amrita School of Pharmacy, Kochi, India, and a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from KMCH College of Pharmacy, Coimbatore, India. Before joining CCAD, he worked at Kovai Medical Center and Hospital (KMCH), Coimbatore, India, and established Clinical Pharmacy Services in a 120-bedded ICU. He has over 25 publications including a book. He has presented more than 30 research papers, and has over 50 invited talks in various international and national conferences. Hisham also serves as a reviewer for the infectious diseases self-assessment program chapters for the American College of Clinical Pharmacy. He received several awards including Honorary Award from Dr. V V Pillay on behalf of the Indian Society of Toxicology, and

the Young Intensivist Award for Best Innovative Research Paper in CRITICARE 2016 at Agra, India by the Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine. At CCAD, Hisham leads the team which established the Emergency Department Pharmacy Services and works as an antimicrobial stewardship pharmacist.



**Dr. Esmita Charani** PhD, MSc, MPharm, ESCMID Fellow

Senior Research Lead for Practice, Design and Engineering at the National Institute of Health Research Health Protection Research Unit (HPRU) in Healthcare Associated Infections and Antimicrobial Resistance. She is also a visiting Researcher at Haukeland University Hospital, Bergen Norway, where she is involved in investigating the implementation of the national antibiotic stewardship programme. She is an Honorary Associate Professor at the University of Cape Town and a faculty member at Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences, Kerala India. She is also the Academy of Medical Sciences Hamied Foundation UK-India AMR Visiting Professor. As a Global Health Fellow with the Office of the Chief Pharmaceutical Officer for England, Esmita is involved in mentoring and supporting NHS healthcare professionals and healthcare teams across Commonwealth countries in partnerships to tackle antimicrobial resistance. She is an Emerging Leader at the International Society for Infectious Disease and a Fellow of the European Society for Clinical Microbiology and Infectious Diseases. She is the Wellcome Trust Career Development Fellow (2023-2027) and a Principal Investigator of two international studies investigating antibiotic drug shortages and implementation of social science research into clinical trials in pediatric infectious diseases. She is the recipient of the RPSGB Galen Pharmacy Research Award for research into antibiotic dosing and obesity. She is an investigator in a NIHR Invention for Innovation award investigating the development and use of a point of care personalized clinical decision support tool for antimicrobial prescribing. She is co-investigator on the ESRC award (2017-2021): Optimizing antibiotic use along surgical pathways: addressing antimicrobial resistance and improving clinical outcomes (in England, Scotland, Rwanda, India & South Africa). She is an investigator in a National Institute of Health Research Invention for Innovation award investigating the development and use of a point of care personalized clinical decision support tool for antimicrobial prescribing.



**Dr. Abdul Ghafur** MD, MRCP, FRCPath

Senior Consultant and Adjunct Professor in Infectious diseases at the Apollo Hospitals, Chennai. His pivotal role as the Coordinator of the famous "Chennai Declaration" has helped India in acknowledging the imminent danger of AMR and this has started a chain reaction of activities to contain AMR. He is the managing Trustee of "AMR Declaration Trust"- a public charitable Trust founded on the principles of Chennai Declaration. He is a former technical advisory committee member for the National antibiotic policy of the Indian Ministry of Health. Besides, he is an advisory and Jury member of the "Longitude Prize"- a ten million Sterling Pound Prize announced by the British prime minister. He has delivered lectures in numerous prestigious international Infectious diseases and antibiotic policy conferences and his research works have been published in well-reputed journals such as the BMJ, Lancet, etc. Additionally, he is an editorial board member and reviewer of many international journals. He has also received the Indian Medical Association Oration award for his contribution towards tackling antibiotics resistance efforts.
